2022 COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The 18th annual FBINAA Michigan Chapter College Scholarship program is now accepting applications for 2022. The deadline is May 1, 2022. These scholarships grant up to \$2,750 over four years to recipients to assist with their continuing education at an accredited college or university. A maximum of three (3) scholarships will be funded every year and awarded as follows:

Freshman Year: \$500; Sophomore Year \$500; Junior Year \$750; Senior Year \$1,000

Scholarship Program Purpose:

- Encourage college education
- Promote community involvement
- Encourage active membership in the FBI National Academy Associates – Michigan Chapter or attendance and graduation from the Michigan Police Executive Development Seminar (MPEDS)

Eligibility: Only High School Seniors are eligible to apply, and must be a son, daughter, stepchild, niece, nephew, or grandchild of an active FBINAA Michigan Chapter member or graduate of MPEDS.

Requirements: Scholarship recipients will be required to attend school full-time, maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, and enrollment/education must be continuous for the full four years, with the exception of summer breaks.

How To Apply: Students wishing to be considered must complete a Nomination Form, which is located on the Chapter website at: www.fbinaamichigan.org

The FBI National Academy Associates Michigan Chapter will offer scholarships of \$2,750 to selected students for post-secondary education at an accredited College or University.

The intent of this program is to:

- Encourage college education
- Promote community involvement
- Encourage active membership in the FBI National Academy Associates – Michigan Chapter or attendance and graduation from the Michigan Police Executive Development Seminar (MPEDS)

A maximum of three (3) scholarships will be funded every year and paid as follows: Freshman year \$500; sophomore year \$500; junior year \$750; senior year \$1,000. To be eligible, students must be a son, daughter, stepchild, grandchild, or niece or nephew of an active member of the Michigan Chapter of the FBINAA or graduate of MPEDS.

The following requirements must be maintained to continue to receive the scholarship for four years. The student must:

- attend school full time, (a minimum of 12 credits)
- maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- college attendance must be continuous, with the exception of summer break

Only high school seniors are eligible to apply. Students who wish to be considered must complete a nomination form, which can be downloaded from the Michigan Chapter website.

The awards will be made no later than June 10, 2022. All applicants will be notified.
