Michigan Police Executive Development Seminar (MPEDS) 2023

The <u>Michigan Police Executive Development Seminar (MPEDS)</u> is sponsored by FBI Detroit and the Michigan Chapter of the FBI National Academy Associates (FBINAA). This program is designed with small department executives in mind, providing access to information, programs, and instructors previously only available to larger departments. Executive officers serving in a department of 50 or less sworn members will be given priority for attendance.

As a participant in the Seminar, you will independently and in cooperation with others, experience a program that forces you to think about your role as a law enforcement executive. During the Seminar, you will examine issues of importance to people in this role, experience life-like examination of organizational behavior through media, leadership and legal training, share experiences and problems experienced by others in small departments, and develop solutions that will make you a better executive. While the principles of the Seminar remain the same, course work and other activities may change to reflect the need of participants and consideration of professional trends. This program is sanctioned by the Law Enforcement Executive Development Association (LEEDA) and graduates are invited to join the organization.

This Seminar is limited to thirty-eight (38) students and applicants are registered on a "first-come-first-served" basis. Registration cost for the seminar is \$700.00 per person and includes all meals and training materials. Applications must be completed online. The \$700.00 payment can be paid on the website or by mailing a check to: FBINAA Michigan Chapter, P.O. Box 531596, Livonia, MI 48153-1596. Checks should be made payable to: FBINAA Michigan Chapter.

Once you have completed the registration, you will receive an email with instructions and information to reserve a room for \$85 per night at the Garland Lodge and Resort.

Only applications with payment will be considered for enrollment, and once the seminar is filled, money will be returned to unsuccessful applicants. **Due to contractual agreements, participants cancelling after August 4, 2023 will not be able to receive refunds.**

FBINAA Michigan Hosts the 21st Annual Spring Luncheon



The Michigan Chapter hosted the spring luncheon on Friday, April 21 at Burton Manor in Livonia. The morning started with a little excitement due to a very large gathering ending just prior to the start of the luncheon, but it appears everyone was able to get into the parking lot on time!

This year we continued to have a great turnout with 90 people in attendance. Everyone enjoys the social time prior to the start of the luncheon to catch up with friends.

Our speaker this year was Mark Hackel, County Executive of Macomb County. Mr. Hackel has been in this role since the position was created in 2011. Mr. Hackel was the Sheriff of Macomb County from 2001 to 2010.

Mr. Hackel gave a great speech – discussing a variety of topics. He gave an overview of the collaborative law enforcement facility that they have created in Macomb County and expressed how this is not only a model for Michigan, but nationally as well. He explained that housing multiple agencies under one roof allows the ability to provide better services to members of their county and creates an excellent environment for communication between various partners.

He also talked about the need for improvement with mental health issues, not only in Macomb County, but everywhere. He explained that they are expanding the jail in Macomb County and improving the mental health services they can provide to those in need. They will provide evaluations on subjects and those evaluations can follow the person to different facilities to allow each facility to address their needs. He also expressed his desire for this type of treatment to be offered more consistently moving forward.

After the motivational speech concluded, we recognized the newest and oldest FBINA Session members with a gift card. The newest was Chris Egan from the 284th Session and the oldest was Ron Hnilica from Session 148.

A gathering of FBINA partners would not be complete without a 50/50 raffle and a gun raffle. The winner of the Glock 43 was Chip Bazzy, and the gun was acquired from the Firing Line, in Westland.
