The 20th annual FBINAA Michigan Chapter College Scholarship program is now accepting applications for 2024. The deadline is May 3, 2024. These scholarships grant up to \$2,750 over four years to recipients to assist with their continuing education at an accredited college or university. A maximum of three (3) scholarships will be funded every year and awarded as follows:

Freshman Year: \$500; Sophomore Year \$500; Junior Year \$750; Senior Year \$1,000

Scholarship Program Purpose:

- ➤ Encourage college education
- > Promote community involvement
- Encourage active membership in the FBI National Academy Associates Michigan Chapter or attendance and graduation from the Michigan Police Executive Development Seminar (MPEDS)

Eligibility: Only High School Seniors are eligible to apply, and must be a son, daughter, stepchild, niece, nephew, or grandchild of an active FBINAA Michigan Chapter member or graduate of MPEDS.

Requirements: Scholarship recipients will be required to attend school full-time, maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, and enrollment/education must be continuous for the full four years, with the exception of summer breaks.

How To Apply: Students wishing to be considered must complete a Nomination Form, which is located on the Chapter website at: www.fbinaamichigan.org

Deadline: Nomination form must be completed no later than May 3, 2024.
