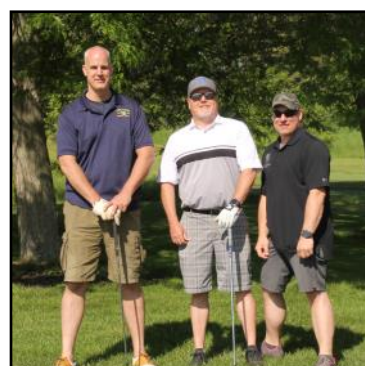
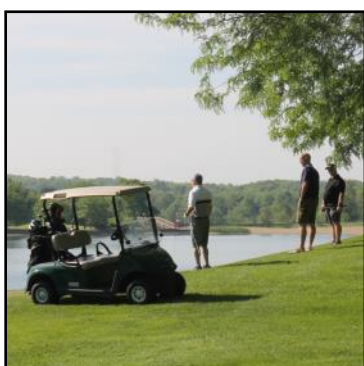
FBINAA MICHIGAN CHAPTER ANNUAL GOLF OUTING

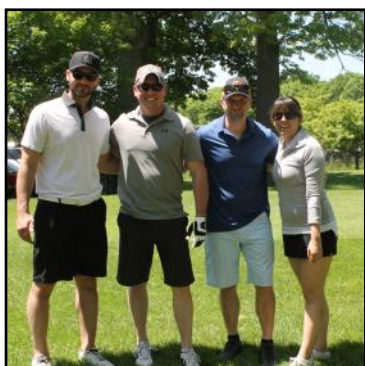
